2016 PIKE GOLF OUTING AND REUNION A SUCCESS

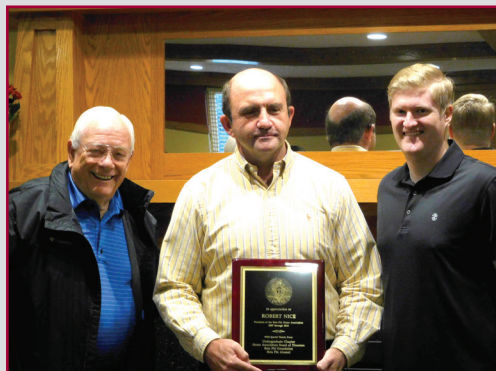

After 25 years on the board of directors of the Home Association, serving the last eight as its president, a new season has arrived for me. It is time for new leadership to take over the reins. With fondness, I appreciate the opportunity to reflect on this past "season."

I was blessed to live in the house with a group of achievers. We won at athletics, we had a great social calendar, we were active on campus, and we were recognized nationally with three Smythe awards. As an undergraduate, that was the order of importance to me. I probably

feel differently today about what that order should be.

When I took over as president, the Home Association was broke. During the first two months, we had a failure of some water tanks and the estimated cost of repair was \$12,000. Problem was, we only had \$5,000 in the bank. Thank God (or at least **Rich Russell '58**) for the Beta Phi Foundation. With its financial backing, we promptly made the needed repairs and restored hot water to the house. Please continue to support the foundation with an annual gift. Things have changed greatly since I began. We recently completed a \$1.5 million renovation of the Chapter House. We have a low interest mortgage and we are paying it down ahead of schedule. We have adequate operating funds, a savings account, and a furniture reserve fund. We annually buy Pike jerseys for all the brothers—in house and out of house—which they wear proudly on campus and which serves as a great marketing tool to prospects and to sororities. We continue to be recognized as one of the strongest fraternities at Purdue. Help us keep it that way by sending recommendations for young men known to you who will be attending Purdue!

We've done a lot of things over the years, but I have two favorites. I personally chose to put up the huge Pi Kappa Alpha letters across the top of the front of the house. Anyone within a block of us will know who we are without having to read Greek letters. Second, we have a Goalrilla basketball goal and a new concrete pad for a smooth half court. All of the old trees behind it have been removed, so no more upheaval. Our letters are "in the paint" in garnet and gold.

My final effort was to plan for the future. My successor is **Matt Folz, Theta Omicron '07**. He was a Pike at Indiana State (where they've earned about 25 Smythes in 35 years). He then worked for nationals for a year before going to law school. While with nationals, Matt helped with our recruitment program and contributed significantly to the uptick in quality of membership we have experienced over the last five years. Matt is now a practicing attorney and has served on our board for the past three years. I know you will give him the support I have received from so many of you.

I will continue serving the fraternity as a member of the Long-Range Planning Committee of the foundation. Safe travels until our paths cross again!

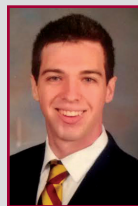
Pi Kappa Alpha Succeeds in Campus Involvement, Philanthropic Events

The last six months have been extremely busy and rewarding for the Beta Phi Chapter! We ended the spring semester with over \$6,800 raised for the American Cancer Society by participating in Purdue's Relay for Life, taking home the campus and Greek cups for the event. The fraternity finished with our best GPA (2.97) and philanthropy dollars raised (\$9,345) in my four years as a Pike. We also finished with more community service hours (3,019) than any other Chapter on campus. These achievements were enough to earn us an Orians Excellence award at the national convention in New Orleans this summer as among the top 20% of Pike Chapters in the nation.

The Chapter shows no sign of slowing down as we complete the fall semester. Thirty-nine new members signed bids during recruitment, giving us one of the largest classes on campus. Pike's Firefighter Challenge continued to grow and raised over \$6,000 for the National Fallen

Firefighter's Foundation. The Dream Girl competition has returned to the Chapter for the first time in many years and is already being highly contested by the sorority women on campus. Pike won the campus Greek Olympics competition and took home the Greek Cup in Purdue Dance Marathon.
